Brasserie St Feuillien - Belgium

St. Feuillien is a family owned brewery founded in 1873 and located in the town of Le Roeulx – southwest of Brussels in Belgium. It is currently run by the fourth generation of the Friart family on the original site of the Abbey of Premonteres (now Abbaye St-Feuillien du Roeulx).

The brewery is the producer of several international award winning beers. The full product line includes a Blonde, Triple, Brune, Saison, Grand Cru, a Noel, and a line of fruit and wit beers under the Grisette label.



Triple

The Triple is a medium to full bodied Belgian Triple. On the nose there is a definite fruity aroma that also carries honey, spice, and typical Belgian yeast aromatics. Flavors include a mélange of malts, apricot/peach/banana, spice, and Belgian yeast. Compared to other Belgian Triples it is crisp and dry, less yeasty, and very refreshing.

ABV of 8.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24; plus specialty 9L bottles.



Brune

The Brune is a classic example of a Belgian Abbey Dubbel, malty and fruity, with a good dose of caramel and a touch of spice. It is somewhat sweet and rich, with medium to full body.

ABV of 8.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.



Quad

New to St Feuillien in 2020 the Quad complements the line of exceptional quality Belgians. Aromas of raisins, caramel, soft malts, and vinous wood. Flavors of caramel, sweet malts and dark fruit. Slight sweet overall with distinctive St Feuillien yeast.

ABV of 11%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.

Saison

This beer is a great example of style in the hard to define Farmhouse/Saison category. It is crisp and fruity, yeasty and tangy, and quite refreshing. Well known worldwide.

ABV of 6.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24



Grand Cru

The Grand Cru is a strong blonde ale unique to St Feuillien. It has big hoppy/citrusy aromas and flavors are complex with interesting yeast, spice/pepper, and lemon notes. The Grand Cru has won multiple awards over the past ten years.

ABV of 9.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24



Grisette Blanche Bio

The Grisette Blanche Bio belongs to the rich family of Belgian wit beers. It's a very refreshing and easy to drink beer that remains well bodied and savory. Citrusy orange, coriander, and wheat all come to play in a nice classic balance. Certified organic.

ABV of 5.5%. Available in 250ml bottles, case of 24.

Cuvee de Noel

The Noel is one of the best winter beers in Belgium. It is produced annually as a vintage product and is generally available after September. The beer is creamy and warm with a big malt and toffee presence and lots of spice. Brewed for cellaring.

ABV of 9%. Available in 750ml bottles - case of 6.

De Dolle Brouwers - Belgium

De Dolle (Mad Brewer) is one of the original and historic Craft breweries in Belgium with a worldwide following. Founded and still managed by Kris Herteleer, the brewery focuses on Belgian styles with very limited production. Quirky and artistic in image, but high in quality, the beers are a sought after experience and can be cellar aged.

Oerbier



The name Oerbier refers to the originality and purity of the beer. There is a fresh acidity due to the yeast and lactic acid bacteria. The beer is dark, due to the mixture of different types of malt and cooking time. Only 'Golding' bubble hops from Poperinge are used and all beers are bottled with secondary fermentation. This is the first beer brewed by De Dolle and officially dates from 1980. Aromas of toasted malts and dark fruit. Slightly sour flavors with fruit, wood barrel, and red wine notes. Really well balanced.

ABV of 9.0%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 20

Oerbier Reserva



Bottled again in 2024. Initially resting for 1 year in Italian Amarone red wine barrels then transferred to French and American oak barrels; aged until ready and finally blended to achieve the desired flavors. The Reserva is a complex Oud Brune with wonderful barrel notes.

ABV of 10%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 20.

Arabier



Arabier is a Belgian Strong with secondary fermentation in the bottle and hopped with flower hops (Nugget and WGV - Whitbread Golding Variety) from Poperinge. Aromas of summer fruit and bready malts. Flavors of toasted malts, dried apricots, oranges, spice, and resin.

ABV of 8.0%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 20.

Dulle Teve



Dulle Teve is the definitive De Dolle Belgian Tripel. From the De Dolle literature: "Dulle Teve is a name used in the region for a nasty woman. This was first used by a pub owner who wanted his own beer and was tasting two different possibilities in the De Dolle Oerbar. His wife became increasingly impatient and phoned him. At that moment the pub owner remarked: "Do you know what you are? A dalle teve!" The name stuck.

Aromas of lemons, light malts and ripe yellow fruit. Flavours of candied fruit, light bananas, toasted malts, and a bit of ginger.

ABV of 10%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 20.

Still Nacht



If you know you know! Still Nacht is a prestige beer sought out by beer enthusiasts for cellaring and sampling as it ages. Still Nacht is an annual winter beer that has been brewed since 1986. It is noted for its high density, complexity and beautiful flavors. Typically, there are aromas of orange zest, licorice, and phenol; and flavors of honey, toasted malts, spices, and bitter orange.

First time in Canada!

ABV of 12%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 20.

Abbaye des Rocs - Belgium

Located in Montignies-sur-Rocs in Hainaut province near the French border this very small family run brewery (less than 2000 hl annually) started commercial operation in 1979 and is located on the original site of the Abbaye des Rocs. Some of the buildings date from the original abbey and water is still drawn from the original source on the abbey grounds.

Run by Nathalie Eloir, one of the few women brewsters in Belgium, the brewery focuses on artisanal products using original recipes that have been handed down through generations. A number of dark, complex, Abbey style beer are brewed in a traditional manner along with a number of lighter blondes and witbiers.



Grand Cru

The Grand Cru is a big malty, Abbey style beer. It is very complex, with lots of dark fruit, cherries, and caramel in the mix, plus hints of licorice and tobacco to make things interesting. Smooth and medium to full bodied.

ABV of 9.5%. Available in 750ml bottles, case of 12.



Triple Imperiale

The Triple Imperiale is a big Belgian Dark Strong Ale. It is malty, soft, full bodied, and sweet. There is definite dark fruit and malts to the nose, and the flavors carry these along with a good dose of caramel, a bit of orange/citrus and a hint of chocolate. A good pairing as an appetizer or with a dessert.

ABV of 10%. Available in 750ml bottles, case of 12.

Bockor Brouwerij (Brouwerij VanderGhinste)

Located in Bellegem in West Flanders near the French border, this one hundred year old brewery is one of the few remaining family run breweries still brewing Flanders sours using traditional spontaneous fermentation and barrel aged methods.



Cuvee des Jacobins Rouge

Cuvée des Jacobins Rouge is a Flanders Sour Red Ale, garnet red in color with a balance of malty sweetness and acidic sharpness. The characteristics of the beer are a result of spontaneous fermentation and an 18 month aging in French oak cognac barrels. The beer has a strong aroma of oak and flavors of sour cherries, vanilla, and fruit abound. Bronze medal (Belgian and French Ales) 2015 Vancouver Magazine Craft Beer Awards. Gold Medal winner for Best Wood Aged Beer at the World Beer Awards.

ABV of 5.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.



VanderGhinste Oud Bruin

This Flanders Oud Bruin was the first beer brewed by Bockor in 1892 and is a regional product that can only be brewed in Southern West-Flanders. The aroma is dark fruit and wood, and the taste is characterized by a balance of fruitiness and a soft tartness. Ultimately tart and refreshing, the Oud Bruin won a gold medal in the category "Oud Bruin" at the World Beer Awards.

ABV of 5.5%. Available in 250ml bottles, case of 24.

De La Senne

Based in Brussels, Brasserie De La Senne is a young Craft brewery which got into full production in 2010. The beers range from traditional to modern; from classic Belgian Triples to multiple Saison variants to hoppy ales.



Zinnebir

Zinnebir is a Belgian Pale Ale and is the original founding beer at De La Senne. Visually a golden amber color, it develops fruity and floral hoppy aromas reminiscent of dried apricot and orange marmalade. Flavors follow with additional citrus and malty notes; finishing with a nice bitterness.

ABV of 5.8%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.



Brussels Calling

Brussels Calling is De La Sennes's annual anniversary beer. The base is always a 6.5% Belgian IPA, but different hops are used every year. Generally, the nose is intense in exotic fruits and floral notes. On the palate these fruity and floral notes continue and intensify. The 2024 version leans toward tropical fruit.

Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.



Bruxellensis

The Bruxellensis is a Brett Pale Ale, refermented for several months with a wild yeast of Brussels origin. Amber with coppery highlights, it has a fruity attack (pineapple and red fruits) and is supported by aromas of hops and complex notes of old leather. Flavors follow with a soft maltiness and a persistent, almost candied fruitiness. The finish is dry and bitter.

ABV of 6.5%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24.

Jambe de Bois

Jambe-de-Bois or “Peg-Leg” is a generously hopped Belgian Triple. The aromas of Belgian yeast dominate and are reminiscent of pear and ripe banana. Hops then add floral and spicy notes (white pepper and nutmeg) to the flavor. The alcohol content gives the beer a nice roundness, and it finishes dry, sharp, and slightly bitter.

ABV of 8.0%. Available in 330ml bottles, case of 24

Brouwerij Kees - the Netherlands

Kees Bubberman, the Emelisse brewer of fame, has his own brewery! Same philosophy as before – great base beers with barrel variants. And just like with Emelisse, Kees is getting great reviews. He is so successful it's a challenge getting his beers. But, it's definitely worth it when available!

Caramel Fudge Stout



Dark rich chocolatey fudge. And a ton of it... Lots of dusty dark chocolate, sweet rich coffee and cream, vanilla, and sweet roasted malts with a little spice. Slick, almost syrupy. An Imperial chocolate explosion and a decadent dessert beer.

ABV of 11.5%. Available in 330ml cans, case of 24.

American Barley Wine



Lighter than Kees' previous behemoths, this barley wine is still big and full, and also worthy of cellaring. Malty and sweet when young, there are a multitude of flavors including rich caramel, oranges, ripe fruit, and vanilla.

ABV of 11.5%. Available in 330ml cans, case of 24.

Export Porter 1750



Don't get fooled by the name – this is really a Russian Imperial Stout, and just as good if not better than some of Kees' previous stouts. Big and complex. Smooth and slightly warming. Bittersweet with roasted malts, caramel, dark chocolate, black coffee, licorice and molasses. Yummy. Top notch.

ABV of 10.5%. Available in 330ml cans, case of 24.

Hanssens Artisanaal – Belgium

Hanssens Artisanaal is a very small, traditional lambic blenders located in Dworp, Belgium. It is a family run operation that is one of the oldest lambic blenders in Belgium. They have been blending since 1871! The family has continued to focus on the traditional Lambic and Gueuze styles while also recently experimenting with various new fruited Lambics and a Mead/Gueuze blend.



Oude Gueuze

As with all Gueuzes, Hanssens is a mixture of several vintages. A second fermentation takes place inside the bottle, which is stored for a minimum of six months. The result is refreshingly fruity. The Oude Gueuze pours a hazy copper with a light head. Aromas of barnyard and citrus. Flavors of sour peach candies, additional stoned fruit, citrus, and tart wheat.

ABV of 6%. Available in 375 ml bottles, case of 24.



Oude Kriek

The Oude Kriek is a blended black cherry lambic of different ages with a second fermentation in the bottle. Pours a deep red with lots of sharp black cherries in the aromas and flavors. Crisp, with a light body. Oh...It has a thirty year Best Before. Definitely a cellarable lambic that will evolve over time.

ABV of 6%. Available in 375 ml bottles, case of 24.



Schaarbeekse Kriek

The Schaarbeekse is simply incredible. Produced with handpicked Schaarbeekse krieks (sour cherries), it pours a beautiful garnet red with little head, and has intense aromas of dark cherries. The flavors are even more intense and very tart; a mix of cherry skins, cranberries, and red berries. Plus a little funk.

ABV of 6%. Available in 375 ml bottles, case of 24.

Pohjala – Estonia

Põhjala was founded in Tallinn, Estonia at the end of 2011 by four Estonian beer enthusiasts and home brewers. Soon thereafter the company was joined by Scottish head brewer, Chris Pilkington, bringing experience from Brewdog. The first Põhjala beer, Öö Imperial Baltic Porter, was released in the beginning of 2013. Most notable are the Põhjala Cellar Series, generally special barrel aged variants of core and unique beers, plus collaborations.



Öö

Meaning Night, Öö is a big Imperial Baltic Porter and a core beer. Aromas of sweet molasses, soy, and black coffee. Flavours follow same with additional dark chocolate and nuttiness.

ABV of 10.5%. Available in 330ml bottle, case of 24.



Öö X

Also from the Cellar Series, this is Öö aged in newly emptied Cognac barrels. Aromas of fruity cognac, chocolate nougat, raisins and caramel malts. Flavors follow same with emphasis on caramel and additional chocolate.

ABV of 13%. Available in 330ml bottle, case of 24.
